



Whatever our goals - the key challenge facing all nations is for the World's diverse peoples and cultures to better understand one another and achieve global cooperation to tackle current existential threats




Why the Royal Borough of Greenwich?



- 1. The Greenwich meridian is the symbolic "home of time" and a global geomarker
- 2. Greenwich has a long history of global connections through trade
- 3. The 6 million British citizens of Commonwealth descent in the UK and the cultural diversity of this diaspora are wellrepresented in Greenwich



- 4. Greenwich embraces progressive ecological urbanism and Smart City technologies, that need to spread globally
- 5. The Local Authority and Greenwich University both strongly support the Royal Commonwealth Quarter concept





Opportunities to facilitate implementation of the Green Grid vision

Towards a masterplan for a 'Commonwealth Quarter landscape' that helps to further visually define the quarter

- 1. The proposed Commonwealth Quarter area lies along the 'Woolwich Links' component of South East London Green Chain Plus area of the All London Green Grid, linking Woolwich Riverside to the key Green Chain sites of Woolwich Barracks and Common
- Development of the Commonwealth Quarter could help to fund green grid implementation and enhancements
- 3. A bespoke landscape design could help bring an overall coherence and identity to the Commonwealth Quarter
- 4. Integrated nature-based solutions would also help to future-proof the Commonwealth Quarter against climate change
- 5. The Commonwealth Quarter would help to promote important active uses at the 'destination point' where the Royal Arsenal meets the Thames, in line with planning policy




A new digital exchange and trading platform to enhance the Commonwealth mercantile network and develop the Commonwealth's creative economy through cross-cultural interaction




An reinvigorated network of Commonwealth nations


